Day 1 Tour Starts in Livingstone

Land in Livingstone and check in to your accommodation. Livingstone is one of Zambia's main cities in its Southern province bordering Zimbabwe and is famous for Victoria Falls also known as Mosi-oa-Tunya 'The Smoke that Thunders'. Your adventure starts here where outdoor activities are plentiful and traditional culture is in abundance (activities must be booked in advance). Livingstone can offer white water rafting, bungee jumping, village tours, scenic helicopter flights, lion and cheetah walks and more. Also you will have time to grow familiar with the team who will take you on an adventure for the next 12 days.

Day 2 in Livingstone

Come back to your lodge and start getting ready for your upcoming safari and enjoy the ambiance the lodge has to offer.

Day 3 Drive to Chobe National Park

Wake up in Livingstone, Zambia, and prepare yourself for your next adventure by heading to the famous Chobe National Park in Botswana. The drive into the National Park will be the start of your trip to Chobe and the change of scenery will take your breath away. Once you have settled down into camp, get ready for your first of many afternoon game drives. Chobe National Park is famous for its large herds of elephants, buffaloes and numerous predators that come with them. Your first night at Chobe will not disappoint and the surroundings will enable you to absorb the feel of the nature.

Day 4 at Chobe National Park

Your first morning in Chobe will be an unforgettable one with the striking beauty of your new surroundings. The first morning game drive will set the tone for the rest of your stay in Chobe. If it's big game you seek, then Chobe National Park is the right place to be. The vast herds of elephants will forever be ingrained in your memory. Head back to camp after your second game drive of the day and exchange stories over the camp fire.

Day 5 to Savute

Savute is an area in the Chobe National Park and is probably most well-known for its large herds of African Elephants. But this is just the beginning of the park. Discover an entirely different environment within the Okavango Delta as we take a beautiful drive towards your new camp site that will allow you time to take in the surroundings. It will be a similar game drive and night camping experience as Chobe, but with completely different surroundings that will keep you intrigued.

Day 6 in Savute

Enjoy your early morning wake up in Savute with breakfast and a cup of coffee or tea and the aura of the wildlife around you. Start your day with an early morning game drive through Savute. The vast plains of Savute and its diversity of environments will delight you. After the morning game drive, come back to camp and enjoy a lovely lunch that has already been prepared for you. After your afternoon nap amongst nature, or chatting with fellow guests, get ready for your afternoon game drive and explore the other sections of Savute. Then relax back at camp and anticipate your night around the camp fire.

Day 7 Drive to Moremi Game Reserve (Khwai Area)



Wake up for the last time in Savute and start getting ready at your own pace to head to Moremi Game Reserve. The drive towards the Okavango Delta will make you realise how different the topography is between Moremi and your previous camp sites. Moremi is in the heart of the Okavango Delta and therefore wildlife is rich and diverse due to the sheer quantity of water. Settle down at your new camp site in Khwai and prepare yourself for your up-coming afternoon game drive. Khwai is an area within the national park owned by the village of Khwai and located in the heart of the delta. The nights in Moremi are truly a thing of beauty.

Day 8 in the Heart of the Okavango Delta

The Okavango Delta also referred to as ‘Africa’s Last Eden’. It is one of Africa’s most beautiful and well preserved ecosystems. The Okavango Delta is affected by seasonal flooding with flood water from Angola reaching the Delta between March and June, peaking in July. This peak coincides with Botswana’s dry season resulting in great migrations of game from the dry hinterland. Your days camping in the Moremi Game Reserve will be an unforgettable experience to your journey.

Day 9 in Moremi Game Reserve (Xakanaxa Area)



Sky Theme Safaris – Nature at its Most Beautiful

Wake up in a wonderland and let your imagination be taken away by the striking sunrise and the smell of the African bush. Today you will be heading to a nearby campsite in the Xakanaxa area, the drive towards your new campsite in the morning will act as a game drive since both areas are within the national park. The Okavango Delta supports large concentrations of animals on both a permanent and seasonal basis. Through careful wildlife management it has become perhaps one of the best places to see animals and birds in Africa. Scenic game drives through the game reserve will undoubtedly leave you satisfied.

Day 10 in Moremi Game Reserve

Enjoy your final day in Moremi. Today will be your last chance to see unexplored parts of Moremi. The diversity of Moremi is what makes it truly special - from vast plains to dense woodlands and deltas. If it's a passion for flora and fauna or large game, then Moremi is the right environment to see them all. Embrace your last dinner in the bush with a beverage of your choice and stories to tell around the camp fire.

Day 11 Drive to Maun



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Wake up at your own pace with a nice cup of coffee or tea in hand and enjoy your surroundings for one last time. The final leg of your trip will end in Maun, however the drive there will take you through the Game Reserve for one final viewing of the wildlife and a chance to take final photos and absorb the wonderful fragrance of the African bush. Arrive at your lodge in Maun and relax with your free time in your new surroundings.

Accommodation and Meals



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The majority of the lodges that we stay in on this trip have a small swimming pool. We also spend time camping in the wilderness sites in Moremi Game Reserve and Chobe National Park. The tents that you will be using include; camp beds, bedding and pillows which are all provided. The camp assistants are here to make your stay as comfortable and enjoyable as possible. You will have all of the modern comforts yet still be in close proximity to the African bush. This will make your experience more pleasant and more memorable.

Food and Drinks

Included meals: 8 breakfasts, 9 lunches and 8 dinners are included in the price of the tour. Please be prepared to pay for non-included meals and please take note that prices for drinks and meals may vary between locations.

Important Information

Travel Insurance

It is a condition of joining **any** of our tours that you must have valid travel insurance. It must indicate that you have cover for (at least) medical expenses and emergency repatriation in the event of illness or injury. We also strongly recommend your policy includes curtailment, personal effects and cancellation protection as all deposits paid are non-refundable. You will also need to ensure your travel policy covers you for all activities, outside of STS, that you intend to do whilst on your tour. Your insurer may charge an additional premium for certain activities.



Visa Information

Botswana and Namibia: visas are not required by UK, Australian, New Zealand, US and Canadian passport holders. All other nationalities please consult your nearest Embassy for up to date advice on necessary visa requirements.

Zambia: Visas are required by UK, Canadian, US, Australian and New Zealand passport holders. Please note it is possible for UK passport holders to obtain their visa on arrival at all ports of entry.

All other nationalities, please consult your nearest Embassy for up to date advice on necessary visa requirements.

All passports must have a minimum of 6 months' validity from date of return to your home country. Please note: Be aware that visa information is subject to change and that you must not rely on STS to be fully aware of all visa requirements for all countries. Please ensure you inform yourself on this matter.

Lone Parents

In Botswana single parents or other adults travelling alone with children should be aware that some countries require documentation confirming that the individual has authority to travel with the minor. You should contact the Botswana Embassy for further information and details.



Vaccinations and Protection

Botswana: Nothing compulsory, but we do recommend protection against malaria, hepatitis A, tetanus, typhoid and polio. Consult your travel clinic for the latest advice on different prophylaxis available against malaria. Travellers may wish to immune themselves against meningitis. The above is not an exhaustive list. Further information regarding vaccinations and travel health advice can be found by following the NHS and NaTHNaC and from your local healthcare provider in your country. Visa vaccination requirements are subject to change and should be confirmed before departure. Please ensure you inform yourself on this matter.

Zambia: We strongly recommend protection against malaria, hepatitis A, tetanus, diphtheria, typhoid and polio. Malaria is present in the region so consult your travel clinic for the latest advice on different prophylaxis available against malaria. Yellow fever is compulsory for all travel into Zambia if transiting via South Africa or any other Yellow Fever Zone. Please ensure that you inform yourself of all requirements.

Preparing for your Tour

Climate

Botswana: Botswana has many regional characteristics that differ - from fertile areas in the East to vast desert in the centre and South and a vast delta in the North-West. This creates extremes of temperatures and highly variable rainfall.

Zambia: The main rainy season is from January to March. The rain is widespread and generally falls in the form of thunderstorms; grass tends to be long and there is more water about which makes game viewing more dispersed.



Clothing

Clothing should be lightweight. However, a wind/waterproof jacket, a warm fleece or sweater and thermal underwear for night time is strongly advised. Night temperatures and early morning game drives can be very cold, especially in the winter (April to August). Brightly coloured and white clothing is not suitable for game viewing.

Equipment

Bring a head/hand torch, a water bottle, a sunhat, sunglasses, insect repellent and sunscreen. Binoculars are essential for game viewing and a 300mm lens is recommended for photography.

Footwear

Lightweight trail and/or steel cap boots are vital and sandals for relaxing in.

General Information

Food

The prices for meals and drinks can vary greatly depending upon location. In general, you would expect that drinks purchased in a supermarket or a local bar to be less expensive. Whilst drinks in an upmarket bar, lodge or restaurant may be more expensive.
